

DEFINITION AND KEY TERMS

- **Cookie:** a small amount of data generated by a website and saved by your web browser. It is used to identify your browser, provide analytics, and remember information about you, such as your language preference or login information.
- **Company:** When this policy mentions “**Stackflow**” “**Company**,” “**we**,” “**us**,” or “**our**,” it refers to Stackflow Technologies UK Ltd. (Address: 60A, Station Road, North Harrow London HA2 7SL, United Kingdom), that is responsible for your information under this Cookie Policy.
- **Device:** any internet-connected device such as a phone, tablet, computer or other devices that can be used to visit Stackflow and use the services.
